THOUSANDS TO GATHER FOR AIDS WALK SAN FRANCISCO TO FUND CUTTING-EDGE CARE FOR LONG-TERM SURVIVORS OF HIV AMONG OTHER VITAL PROGRAMS

Dr. Paul Volberding to Address Crowd live from International AIDS Conference in Durban, South Africa

San Francisco, CA, July 11, 2016 – Thousands will gather in Golden Gate Park on Sunday, July 17 for the 30th annual AIDS Walk San Francisco (AWSF). This year's event will help launch a ground-breaking new model of specialized care at San Francisco General Hospital's Ward 86 for long-term survivors of HIV, as well as provide substantial funds to two other lead beneficiaries, Project Inform and Project Open Hand. As in years past, AIDS Walk participants are also raising funds to benefit many other vital HIV/AIDS service providers throughout the Bay Area.

"After years of seeking, and being denied, government funding for this unprecedented program focusing on older people living with HIV, AIDS Walk has delivered in a big way, said **Dr. Paul Volberding**, internationally renowned and pioneering HIV/AIDS specialist who co-founded Ward 86 in 1983. "With help of such strong allies, we will be able to launch this new program of specialized medical care which is urgently needed and richly deserved by those who have been living with HIV long-term."

Dr. Volberding, the Honorary Chair of this year's AIDS Walk San Francisco, will speak live at the event via telephone from the International AIDS Conference in Durban, South Africa during the event's Opening Ceremony to thank the crowd of AIDS Walk supporters for their pivotal role in funding this new initiative. The leaders of the other primary beneficiaries will address the attendees in person.

"We are pleased that AIDS Walk San Francisco participants will help us continue working at the Federal, State, and local levels to ensure that all HIV-positive people have access to affordable, effective care and treatment," said **Dana Van Gorder**, Executive Director of Project Inform.

"No one should have to choose between food and medicine," said **Mark Ryle**, Chief Executive Officer of Project Open Hand. "AIDS Walk San Francisco's thousands of caring participants will help us make

certain that fewer people in the Bay Area living with HIV/AIDS will face such dire circumstances, and we are grateful."

AIDS Walk San Francisco is a project of the **AIDS Walk San Francisco Foundation** (AWSFF), which oversees the production of the event. "Oh behalf of the AWSFF Board of Directors, I would like to thank AIDS Walk Founder and Senior Organizer, Craig Miller, as well as the entire AIDS Walk team, for waging a strong and successful campaign this year," said **Serafina Palandech**, AWSFF Board Chair and Co-Founder of the Bay Area-based company, Hip Chick Farms. "Their dedication, as well as the efforts of thousands of caring people who are walking and raising much-needed funds, is sure to culminate in a memorable event on Sunday."

"As the disease continues to pose serious public health challenges, the Walk remains a crucial source of funding for these dozens of community-based groups that provide direct services, advocacy, and prevention efforts to confront HIV and AIDS," added Palandech.

Since 1987, AWSF has raised more than \$84 million for dozens of Bay Area HIV/AIDS service organizations and has long been Northern California's largest AIDS fundraising event.

What: AIDS Walk San Francisco, a 10K fundraising walk to fight AIDS.

Who: Thousands of supporters from throughout the Bay Area will be in attendance. Notable guests at the event's Opening Ceremony will include Dan Ashley (ABC7 News Anchor), Emmy-winning TV personality, Carson Kressley, Dr. Paul Volberding (UCSF's Ward 86), Dana Van Gorder (Project Inform), Mark Ryle (Project Open Hand), Board Members of the AIDS Walk San Francisco Foundation, and Craig R. Miller (AIDS Walk Founder and Senior Organizer). The morning program will also feature performances by Broadway singer Joan Ryan and Leslie McDonel. Elected officials (with more expected to RSVP) will include San Francisco Supervisors Scott Wiener and Norman Yee, and San Francisco Treasurer José Cisneros.
