AIDS WALK NEW YORK PROJECTED TO RAISE OVER \$4.5 MILLION AND DRAWS OVER 30,000 SUPPORTERS

Rosie Perez, Bebe Neuwirth, and other Notable Figures Join in Support of World's Largest Single-Day AIDS Fundraising Event

New York, New York: The 31st Annual AIDS Walk New York (AWNY) projects to raise over \$4.5 million and drew an enormous crowd of 30,000 participants to Central Park. Dozens of corporate sponsors, hundreds of teams, and tens of thousands of individual walkers collectively raised critical funds to support people living with HIV and AIDS and to stop new infections. The 10-kilometer walk benefits GMHC and nearly 40 other vital AIDS service organizations throughout the tri-state area.

"While certain presidential candidates have been spreading vile messages that demean people who are most vulnerable to HIV - all while claiming to know about New York values - our participants have spoken up with their a message of their own: hate is not a New York value," said **Craig R. Miller**, AIDS Walk Founder and Senior Organizer. "The projected \$4.5 million raised today demonstrates the true New York values, and American values, of everyone who walked today: compassion for people in need, tenacity in the face of challenge, and a deep love of their community."

"Every day GMHC delivers life saving services which is made possible because of the generosity of AIDS Walk supporters who over the course of 31 years have raised over \$145 million to support people living with and affected by HIV and AIDS," said **GMHC CEO Kelsey Louie**. "Today, tens of thousands of people helped raise over \$4.5 million, which will allow us to continue serving over 80,000 hot meals a year, to test over 3,000 people a year at our testing center, to advocate at all levels of the government, to offer legal services and so much more. Every walker who participated today is paving the way for us to once and for all demand a cure and eradicate this virus."

A cutting-edge AIDS Walk subway campaign was unveiled earlier this year in response to the hateful rhetoric Miller alluded to, featuring a diverse group of New Yorkers and AIDS Walk supporters,

including actor **Alan Cumming** and AIDS activist **Peter Staley**. Defiant messages such as, "**Hate is not a New York value!**" were displayed in a banner over their heads, with the phrase, "Don't stand for it - walk!" emblazoned across their chests. Organizers credit the bold new ads with mobilizing more walkers to participate and fundraise for this important event.

Rosie Perez (The View) joined other notable AIDS Walk Opening Ceremony participants, including, Bebe Neuwirth (Madam Secretary), Conrad Ricamora (How to Get Away with Murder), Kit Williamson (Mad Men), Erich Bergen (Madam Secretary), Pia Alonzo Wurtzbach (Miss Universe), and Nick Adams (Priscilla, Queen of the Desert).

Jay Armstrong Johnson (Madam Secretary) performed the ballad "If We Only Have Love," and **LaChanze (If/Then, The Color Purple)** closed the Opening Ceremony with her stirring rendition of the AIDS Walk anthem, "You'll Never Walk Alone." Jay Armstrong, Nick Adams, and LaChanze were among the people featured on the new subway poster campaign this year.

Elected officials in attendance included United States Representative **Jerry Nadler**; New York State Senator **Brad Hoylman**; New York State Assemblymembers **Dick Gottfried** and **Jo Anne Simon**; New York City Public Advocate **Letitia James**; Manhattan Borough President **Gale Brewer**; and Bronx District Attorney **Darcel Clark**; NYC Human Resources Administration Commissioner **Steven Banks**.
